Product Story

1. European oak casks seasoned with sherry impart a rich character with hints of dried fruits, spice and chocolate orange.
2. American oak casks seasoned with sherry deliver delicate hints of citrus lemon, coconut and toffee sweetness.
3. American oak casks seasoned with bourbon deliver floral aromas and sweet notes of vanilla and fresh fruits.

This triple cask combination delivers an extraordinarily smooth, delicate yet complex Single Malt matured at The Macallan distillery for a minimum of 21 years.

Dave Broom

Nose: Rich, heavy, shows maturity. 9 Floral notes (violet/pot pourri) and spices (ginger, allspice, nutmeg, candied peels). Oily; floor polish, sandalwood.

Palate: Lively. Fruit, sweet spices and oak pool in the centre. Big with a silky/oily mouthfeel.

Finish: Cocoa butter. Long.

Comment: A cracker, typical of old (and older style) Speyside.

Reservation and cancellation policy


Our contract with the Officer's Mess Kitchen requires that we provide them seven (7) business days notice for them to guarantee accommodation for our requested numbers. Each month an invitation will be sent out to all members of the Society on the first day of the respective month in which the dinner will be held. To accommodate the Kitchen's needs and meet our contractual obligation with them, members are requested to respond to the emailed invitation two Fridays prior to the respective dinner to guarantee a seat at the dinner. After that all requests will be placed on a waitlist.

- For these individuals the process will be as follows, using next October's dinner date as an example:
- Dinner invitations will be sent out Wednesday October 1st, 2008. Please respond to me. I will then acknowledge your request for a seat. Please understand that if you do not hear from me there is no guarantee that a seat will be held for you at the respective dinner. In such circumstances (e.g., computer glitches) please e-mail me again or call (613-634-0397).
- Accommodation at the dinner will be guaranteed for a member who responds by Wednesday October 8th, 2008 midnight. Anyone who asks to cancel their reservation between Thursday October 9th, 2008 midnight and Monday October 20th, 2008 will be expected to pay for the dinner and scotch (\$50). If a wait-listed member can replace the cancellation, then the member will not be asked to pay for their cancellation.
- Anyone who fails to attend the October 20th, 2008 dinner without having cancelled and been successfully replaced will be expected to pay for the dinner and scotch (\$50).
- If a member asks to be included at the dinner between Thursday October 9th, 2008 midnight and Monday October 20th, 2008, your name will be accommodated on a first-come first-serve basis.
